## What's Happening?

### Well it's "Good-bye" to summer and "Hello" to Fall

And the start of a new school year! That means more cars on the road, school buses back in action and lots of kids walking to and from school. Let's give ourselves some extra travel time in addition to plenty of patience and remember to extend simple, common courtesy to others as we all negotiate the heavier traffic patterns of the school season.

Let's not forget that there is a lot of construction taking place throughout town, large pieces of equipment moving about, cables and wires being installed or rerouted and plenty of workers trying to get it all done. Let's give them some respect, too, as well as the many pedestrians out and about, especially in the Main Street area. There's going to be a lot more of all of this in the next several years with the construction of more housing and commercial buildings, along with more road and infrastructure improvements, so PLEASE slow down and drive cautiously through town.

Road improvements are also planned for the southern portion of I-485 from I-77 to NC74. Members of the NC Turnpike Authority, a division of NCDOT, recently attended a council meeting to provide an overview of what those plans entail. Express Lanes are planned for both I-485 and NC74. General purpose lanes for travel will still be available on both roads but an additional "express" variable toll lane will be added to each. This means that the price of the toll will increase as traffic on that lane increases. Users of the express lanes will pay using a transponder installed in their vehicle like an E-Z or Sun Pass used in other states. For those that don't use the express lanes on a regular basis, a camera will take a picture of your license and a bill will be sent to the registered owner. Two additional public meetings were held separately to provide information to other members of the general public.

On another note, thanks to **LIFE SCOUT DANIEL BABB**, we now have a definitive way to dispose of worn, tattered U.S. flags. Residents can drop off worn flags at any of the collections box sites listed below and BSA Troop 7, chartered by Pineville United Methodist Church, will pick them up and store them until they retire the flags in a ceremony that properly respects our national symbol and honors our veterans. 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## MECKLENBURG COUNTY NEWS

### MECKLENBURG COUNTY STORM WATER NEWS:

Mecklenburg County is plentiful with water resources. We have the Catawba River on our western side, which supplies most the water we use in our homes or businesses. Contributing to this river, is a network of over 3,000 miles of streams that run throughout the county. It is essential that we take care of these natural resources and are aware of the environmental impacts that humans can have on them. Poor housekeeping of used motor oil and other automotive fluids can significantly impact our streams and are just one example of harmful environmental impacts caused by humans.

When these substances accumulate on driveways and parking lots, they end up going down the storm drain during the next rain event. Once in the storm drain, the water and anything it is carrying goes directly into a nearby stream, without being cleaned or filtered. After the water enters a stream it can introduce toxic materials into the stream which can be detrimental to aquatic plant and wildlife habitats.

If you have a car leaking fluids, make sure to get it checked and fixed in a timely manner. If you change your own automotive fluids, make sure to store these fluids in a secure container until you can take them to a recycling center for proper disposal. ## TRASH/RECYCLE REMINDERS

**Please remember that if you have a bulk item for pickup such as an appliance, old furniture or equipment, it must be called in to Signature Waste (704-714-9400) so that it can be scheduled for pickup. Computers and TV's cannot be picked up as they are not permitted in the landfills. Yard waste is collected each Wednesday; grass clippings and leaves should be bagged (5 bag limit) and brush/limbs stacked at curb no longer than 3 feet in length and 3 inches in diameter (4 cubic yards per week limit). Limits are in place to ensure that all residents are serviced. Amounts that exceed the limits will be picked up the following week.**

### RESIDENT CARDS

If you live within the city limits of Pineville and pay your taxes to Pineville, then you may use the Belle Johnston Community Center for FREE (fitness equipment, track, basketball court, and racquetball court). But first you need to get your resident card made. We will need proof of residency in the form of a photo ID with current address and a recent bill (ex. gas, electric, telephone). You will have to renew your card every year.





## DMV UPDATE

As many of you know, the DMV operates a mobile unit out of the Pineville Communications Building located at 118 College St. on **Wednesdays ONLY**. This mobile unit is run by the NC Division of Motor Vehicles and is not associated with the Town of Pineville. They simply use our facility to operate out of, and because it's a mobile unit, they do not have phone service so we ask that you **PLEASE DO NOT CALL TOWN HALL OR PINEVILLE COMMUNICATIONS/ELECTRIC for DMV questions.**

The facility is certainly convenient for residents and the general public but it has become very difficult for Pineville Communications/Electric employees to conduct their day-to-day business. Despite signs directing visitors to use the side door, many people continue to walk in the front door disrupting town employees while they're assisting telephone or electric customers. Because this facility has gotten so busy, our employees have not been able to park their cars in the parking lot and what complicates the situation even more, is the limited hours this mobile DMV unit operates. All of this causes tempers to flare which can easily escalate into a more aggressive, unsafe situation.

If you, or someone you know, will be utilizing the services of this facility, please keep in mind the following:

- Operating hours are from 9:00 a.m. until 2:30 p.m. DMV employees may or may not take lunch depending on the volume of traffic that day
- The last person to be serviced is taken at 2:30 p.m. unless the volume of traffic is such that they need to stop earlier
- All DMV customers **MUST** park in the side lot and use the side entrance. The front entrance and parking lot are reserved for Pineville Communications and Electric customers only
- The DMV will try to service Pineville residents first over non-residents
- No registration or tag transactions are done at this location
- Depending on the volume of customers, DMV may choose not to conduct road tests that day
- All customers using this mobile facility should conduct themselves in a courteous, adult manner. Aggression, violence, etc. will not be tolerated and local law enforcement will be called if need be.


