

ELECTRICITIES EMPLOYEES ASSIST IN BUCKET RESCUE

On Friday, October 21, 2022, a tree contractor employee had been

working at an elevated position in a bucket truck behind an apartment building, when his truck became disabled, leaving him stranded 45 feet in the air. At 2:45 pm, Pineville Fire Chief, Mike Gerin, called Electricities in Pineville requesting the assistance of their employees to bring a bucket truck to reach the victim. Electricities is the managing agent for the Town of Pineville's electric system. Crew Leader Brandon Guin, and Apprentice Lineworker II David Carlos, jumped in their 60-foot, two-man bucket truck and responded to the scene.



After assessing the situation, they were able to position their truck close enough to reach and rescue the victim. Electric Systems Manager, David Lucore, stated, "We are honored to be able to assist in the rescue of this person who was stranded at an elevated position. The ability to respond quickly reinforces the value of Public Power

in Pineville and many other towns across North Carolina. Having local workers ready to respond to emergencies like this are an added value to the communities we serve.

The Charlotte and Pineville Fire departments had responded to the distress call and attempted to rescue the stranded man with their ladder trucks but were unable to reach him.



WATER NEWS

Did you know that sediment is the #1 pollutant in Mecklenburg County? Sediment is loose sand, silt, clay, and other particles. When it rains, sediment can flow into storm drains which lead directly to our waterways.

Increased sediment in creeks causes waters to be very turbid, meaning muddy and unclear, which gives the water an orange/brown color. Unfortunately, it can destroy aquatic habitats and smother fish eggs and bottom dwelling organisms. Sediment can come from eroding stream banks and is often seen running off of construction sites without proper erosion control measure and areas with loose dirt. It's important to CALL 311 to report if you see:

- Sediment running off a construction site
- muddy/orange creeks when is has not rained






