# What's Happening...

July begins the new fiscal year for the town. This year was a revaluation year for Mecklenburg County and subsequently the Town of Pineville. Mecklenburg does a revaluation every 4 years to try to combat large swings in tax values for homes. The proposed budget, because of the increase in revaluation, decreases the tax rate to \$0.285 (\$0.045) while still funding critical infrastructure projects and projects to increase the quality of life of residents in Pineville.


Due to the increase in home prices the revenue neutral rate is \$0.245 per \$100, which is a decrease of \$0.085 from the current tax rate of \$0.33. All \$0.04 in the proposed budget above revenue neutral is slated to go employees for salary increases so the town can stay competitive and reward team members for making Pineville a great place to live. Each penny, due to the revaluation, generates about \$365,000 in revenue. This year's total budget of \$37,411,892 for General Fund, Restricted Fund, Telephone, Electric Fund, and Capital Improvement Plan.

The Town has a great Parks and Recreation system. I encourage everyone to take advantage of all the activities, trails, and amenities that our parks provide. The splash pad has been a huge hit since construction. The Town has a program every weekend throughout the summer to include music, races, downtown events, and events.

## TOWN OF PINEVILLE RECOGNIZED AS A RELIABLE PUBLIC POWER PROVIDER

June 15, 2023 – The Town of Pineville, NC has earned the Reliable Public Power Provider (RP3)<sup>®</sup> designation from the American Public Power Association (APPA) for providing reliable and safe electric service.



The American Public Power Association has offered the RP3 designation for 18 years now. APPA is the voice of not-for-profit, community-owned utilities that power 49 million people in 2,000 municipalities nationwide. APPA advocates and advises on electricity policy, technology, trends, training, and operations. The RP3 designation, which lasts for three years, recognizes public power utilities that demonstrate proficiency in four key disciplines: reliability, safety, workforce development, and system improvement.

Criteria include sound business practices and a utility-wide commitment to safe and reliable delivery of electricity. Pineville joins 271 public power utilities nationwide that hold the RP3 designation.

"Receiving an RP3 designation is a great honor signifying a utility has demonstrated commitment to industry best practices," says Troy Adams, Chair of APPA's RP3 Review Panel and General Manager at Manitowoc Public Utilities, Wisconsin. "And ultimately, the culture developed from this pursuit of excellence and continued improvement through the RP3 program results in measurable value delivered to the local community."

"We couldn't be prouder to be honored with this designation," said Ryan Spitzer, Town Manager of Pineville. "This is the culmination of a lot of work from a lot of people who really care about powering our community. But this designation is not a final destination. We are committed to continuing to look for ways to improve our operations and service to our customers."

# Public Service

### MECKLENBURG COUNTY EXPANDS PROPERTY TAX RELIEF PROGRAM



The Mecklenburg County Board of Commissioners (BOCC) recognizes that homeownership is the single most important investment that many residents make in their lifetime. As such, the BOCC has appropriated funds to provide grants to qualifying residential homeowners to address the rising costs of retaining their residences via the Helping Out Mecklenburg Homeowners with Economic Support (HOMES) Program. Grant funds will be paid to the Mecklenburg County Tax Collector, who will reduce the total amount of taxes due for qualifying recipients' primary residence. The amount granted will be equal to 25% of the Mecklenburg County tax amount

on the last available tax bill, rounded to the nearest dollar, not to exceed \$340.

#### TAX STATUS

- Ad valorem real estate taxes within the most recent consecutive three bills must be either paid in full or have no more than one bill of the three delinquents.
  - o Grant funds will first be applied to the current year and any remaining grant amount will be applied to the delinquent prior year bill, if any.
  - o In the instance when funds have been prepaid on the current year bill, the original amount of the current year bill is used to calculate the grant amount.
- Properties with bills that are four or more years delinquent do not qualify.

#### **INCOME REQUIREMENT**

- Household income must not exceed 80% of the area's median income based on number of people in the family. These figures are set annually by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
- Applicants will be required to indicate the number of people that live in the household and provide proof of income. For more information, please go to this link: Property Tax Relief Programs | Assessor's Office (mecknc.gov)

**Property Tax Exemptions** are available for qualifying elderly and disabled residents. Income must not exceed \$33,800. Disabled applicants must have a medical professional complete Form AV-9A Disability Certification. The applicant's name must be on the deed or title to the residence as of January 1st. They must be age 65 or totally or permanently disabled. They must be a North Carolina resident.

**The Circuit Breaker Program** allows qualifying individuals the option to defer a portion of their property taxes owed on their permanent residence. Current deferral limits are: \$33,800 or less – the portion of property taxes that exceeds 4% of the owner's income may be deferred; and \$33,800 but less than or equal to \$50,700 - the portion of the property taxes that exceeds 5% of the owner's income may be deferred.

**Disabled Veteran Homestead Exclusion** excludes from property taxes the first \$45,000 of assessed value for specific real property occupied by a qualifying owner. Requirements include being a veteran or a surviving spouse of a veteran. Documentation of the service-connected permanent and total disability from the U S Department of Veterans Affairs must be provided.

If the Property is Owned by a Veteran (Must meet at least one of the following requirements):

- The veteran must have a total and permanent service-connected disability
- Receive benefits for specially adapted housing under 38 U.S.C. 2101

If the Property is Owned by a Surviving Spouse (The property owner must be the surviving spouse of either):

- A veteran who had a total and permanent service-connected disability
- A veteran that received benefits for specially adapted housing under 38 U.S.C. 2101
- A veteran who died as a result of a service-connected condition

**Historic Property Tax Deferral** Properties designated as historic properties may be eligible for property tax deferrals. To qualify, you must submit a deferment application, which is available online, then submit to the Charlotte Mecklenburg Historic Landmarks Commission (HLC). Once submitted, an HLC representative will schedule a site visit to review the property. Elements qualifying for historical designation will be eligible for city and county tax deferment of 50% of the taxable assessed value. *If a property loses its historical designation, taxes shall be computed as if the property had not been classified for that year, and taxes for the preceding three fiscal years shall be payable immediately with interest as indicated in GS 105-360 for unpaid taxes.*
