# FIRE DEPT.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT REMINDERS & TIPS

As Fire Prevention Month approaches and temperatures start to drop, the Pineville Fire Department would like to share a few reminders and tips about fire safety and prevention:

#### WHEN COOKING, MAKE FIRE SAFETY A PRIORITY BY KEEPING THESE TIPS IN MIND:

- Be alert; if you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol, don't use the oven or stovetop.
- Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling, boiling or broiling food.
- When simmering, baking or roasting, check the food regularly, remain in the kitchen while cooking and use a timer
- Keep anything that can catch fire away from your stovetop.

#### HEATING IS THE SECOND LEADING CAUSE OF HOME FIRES. FOLLOW THESE TIPS FROM THE AMERICAN RED CROSS:

- Keep all flammables, like paper, clothing, bedding, drapes or rugs, at least 3 feet from a space heater, stove or fireplace.
- Never leave portable heaters and fireplaces unattended; turn off heaters and make sure fireplace embers are extinguished before leaving the room.
- If you must use a space heater, place it on a level, nonflammable surface, like ceramic tile, not on a rug or carpet.
- Keep children and pets away from space heaters.
- When buying a space heater, look for models that shut off automatically if the heater falls over.

**WORKING SMOKE ALARMS ARE A MUST** / **REPLACING THE BATTERY ON A SMOKE ALARM.** About three out of five fire deaths happen in homes without working smoke alarms. Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan providing early warning to reduce your risk of dying in a fire. The National Fire Protection Association recommends you:

- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas on the ceiling or high on the wall.
- Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen, at least 10 feet from the stove, to reduce false alarms.
- Use special alarms with strobe lights and bed shakers for people who are hard of hearing or deaf.
- Test smoke alarms monthly.
- Replace batteries in your smoke alarm and carbon monoxide detector annually.
- Replace smoke alarms that are 10 or more years old.

**MAKE AN ESCAPE PLAN.** A home fire is reported every 88 seconds. Once the smoke alarm sounds, a fire can spread quickly, leaving only a minute or two to escape. That's why it's so important to have a home escape plan. Start by drawing a map for your home and follow these guidelines from the NFPA:

- Plan two ways to escape from each room.
- Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
- Identify secondary routes: a window onto an adjacent roof or a collapsible ladder from a second floor window.
- If you live in a multi-story building, plan to use the stairs never the elevator.
- Designate an outside meeting place a safe distance from the house.

### SCOOP IT. BAG IT. TRASH IT.

Our furry friends need exercise just as much as we do. Remember to bring a disposable bag when taking them on a walk just in case nature calls.

Dogs eat the food we give them, much of which is processed. Once digested, this food can contain bacteria that is harmful to humans and animals. When it rains, this bacteria flows with rainwater into the nearest storm drain which leads directly to streams and lakes where many aquatic species live. If you need bags for your walks, email Ashley.Smith@MeckNC.gov with Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services to get some sent directly to you. Mecklenburg Soil and Water Conversation District also has the Urban Cost Share Program for pet waste stations in neighborhoods. #### What is ONE Access<sup>™</sup>?

ONE Access is a collaboration between Charlotte Mecklenburg Library and area schools. The program allows students and staff to use their school ID number to access and check out Library resources.

#### What can students borrow?

ONE Access allows students to borrow digital materials such as e-books, e-audiobooks, magazines, music and video and access Library databases just like any other Library card. Students can also borrow up to 10 print or audio books (no DVDs or music CDs). There are no overdue fines for ONE Access accounts, but users are responsible for fees on lost or damaged books.

#### What services can students access?

- FREE computer use, Internet access, and study spaces. All 21 Library locations have computers and wi-fi that you can use for FREE with your Library card, as well as space to study.
