

## Town History Brief

Pineville, founded in 1873 and named for its abundant pines, originally served as a mule trading center at key Indian trade routes. It was known as Morrow's Turnout and later became a stagecoach stop and railroad hub with the arrival of the Charlotte & Columbia Railroad in 1852, prompting its name change to Pineville. It is the birthplace of President James K. Polk, and while his original home no longer stands, a cabin from that era is preserved alongside other historic buildings.

In the 1880s and 1890s,
Pineville thrived as an
agricultural and textile
center with the Dover
Yarn Mill, later Cone
Mill, employing over 200
people by 1902. By 1903,
its population reached
700, making it the
largest town in
Mecklenburg County
outside Charlotte.






